

2024 Mpox U-Report Chatbot

Objective:

Our goal is to provide accurate information about Mpox to help prevent its spread and combat misinformation. This chatbot will assess awareness among adolescents and young people, identify gaps in understanding, evaluate perceptions of risk, and gauge intention to vaccinate. By gathering this data, we aim to improve UNICEF's response at local, regional and global level.

The chatbot is organized into sections for easy adaptation by country offices. Modules can be released all at once or in segments based on the context and audience engagement. It also includes questions to assess user experience and help us improve.

As an evergreen tool, the chatbot can be available for extended periods, offering continuous value and engagement.
