# **2 Collected feedback**

### 2.1 Requests for functionalities

- User(s) creates a lot of reports so it would be helpful to have an export feature
- The users will use more the platform with the ability to export files (at the

moment requests exports from the dev team)

- Export feature is desired
- The user(s) want to have the ability to have advanced search and filtering options (e.g. country, age, etc.)
- The heatmap feature would be very helpful
- Users use laptop no request for phone interface

### 2.2 Comments on usability

- The user(s) is complaining about seeing a lot of information on one place
- The user(s) think the Overview page is hard to read
- The user(s) would like to see the information in more structured way
- Too many filters, no need for them in Overview section
- The user(s) complains that the data is added without a structure

- The user(s) is confused of how to get the particular data
- No logical way of how to get to the exact page
- A primary function is to display multiple indicators in the same view
- The user(s) like Country and Table pages
- The user(s) like the coloring options (green, blue)
- The dashboard is slow and not obvious in navigation

### 2.3 Comments on data

- Sometimes, data can be old
- Data is sometimes taken from small surveys and it is not obvious that it doesn't cover the whole country

### 2.4 Interaction with RCCE team

- The user(s) informs/wants to inform the dev team of what kind of data is needed
- The user(s) would like to have a form to share a feedback with a team
